


A report from the NEW ENGLAND BOAT SHOW

From February 8 to 17, a great team of FBHI volunteers staffed our booth at the New England Boat Show in the Seaport District.

According to the producer, 51,725 attendees came out to see the huge selection of boats, boat hardware and accessories and groups like the FBHI, the Mass Environmental Trust, Community Boat Building and New England Aquarium. We spoke to hundreds of attendees and vendors and sold our books, memberships and t-shirts. We were aided by a wonderful sign provided by Boston Harbor NOW.

An enormous amount of time was spent at the show, and our goal was to continue to spread the word about the park and the islands. This year we also want to spread the word that the moorings will be available! Hundreds of postcards announcing the moorings were passed out to interested persons. The moorings (essentially floating anchors) will allow recreational boaters to securely tie up and enjoy the Harbor Islands without worrying about their anchors dragging. Then, boaters with a dinghy can make their way to land without worry. Reservations will be completed using DockWa.
